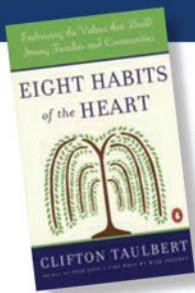

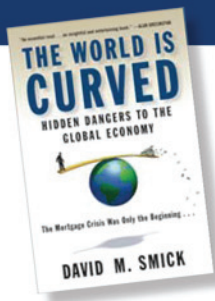


David M. Smick, *The World Is Curved: Hidden Dangers to the Global Economy*

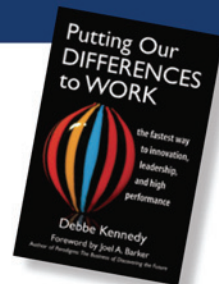


Debbe Kennedy, *Putting Our Differences to Work: The Fastest Way to Innovation, Leadership, and High Performance*
